Parish portion

Euxton Council agreed its budget in January for the financial year, 1st April 2025 to the end of March 2026.

The Parish Council's tax element for an average *band D household will be £37.71, this is only an increase of 74p for the whole year.

This is just over 72p* per week for all the Parish Council services

Council will continue with its ongoing services, such as planting and looking after the flower displays, eco projects, maintaining its own play area and recreation sites, keeping the village litter picked and swept. As well as new projects which will happen through the year which we feature in this newsletter.

The Council welcomes new ideas from its residents about improvements or ways it can provide additional recreation facilities or amenity areas around Euxton and Euxton Buckshaw.

Defib for the Scouts

Euxton Parish Council and County Councillor Aidy Riggott have been working together to help Buckshaw ROF Scout Group secure funding for the purchase and installation a new defibrillator at the Scout Hut on Milestone Meadow in Euxton.

Buckshaw Scouts were successful in securing £750 funding from the Department of Health and Social Care's Community Automated External Defibrillators Fund.

The Parish Council awarded a grant of £500 from its annual grant budget and County Councillor Aidy Riggott awarded a grant of £250 from his Lancashire County Councils Local Members Grant.

Well done Buckshaw ROF Scout Group.









Litter picking kit grant

Euxton Parish Council recently received a small grant of £400 from Chorley Council called FCC Community Environmental Improvements. The Grant will be spent on buying new equipment for the Volunteer litter picking kit.

We hold the litter picking volunteer pack available for groups to use - the pack has gloves, bags, pickers, hoops and hi-viz wear. The kits are used by children's groups such as guides, cubs, scouts etc and the groups educate children to look after their environment and not to litter but also by businesses which give their employees 'community' time to do volunteering projects and they choose to go litter picking.

Central Lancashire Plan

Regulation 19 Consultation

The Central Lancashire Authorities of Preston, South Ribble and Chorley are undertaking a review of the development plan(s) for the area and are working towards the preparation of a Joint Local Plan for Central Lancashire.

This will be a single planning document comprising strategic and development management policies as well as site allocations for future development across the three authorities. Once adopted, the Local Plan will guide the future growth and development of the Central Lancashire area and replace the Central Lancashire Core Strategy (adopted in 2012) and the Local Plans/Site Allocations and Development Management Policies for the three Central Lancashire Authorities (all adopted in 2015). The consultation commenced Monday 24th February and will close on Monday 14th April 2025.

Coronation Living Heritage Fund Grant

Lancashire County Council facilitated the Kings Coronation grant scheme which encouraged living heritage projects.

£4,000 has been granted to create a Community Orchard which is going to be located at the Mellennium Green, as above in the top right of the picture showing 20 fruit trees.

This will be planted up before Spring 2025.

Councillor Profile - Cllr Susan Baines

Susan was co-opted to Council in November 2024.

Sue recently located to Euxton from Horwich with her husband and 2 cats following recent retirement from a 40 year career in the NHS and Higher Education. She has been a Nurse, Midwife, Project Midwife and Manager as well as an independent Midwife and University Lecturer educating health professionals.

Euxton was the couples choice of area to enjoy their retirement. However, Sue has a strong work ethic and always kept herself involved in many things and in 2018 she was elected as a Ward Councillor in Bolton and in 2019 as a Parish Councillor in Blackrod. She has much experience of council work as she was made Executive Cabinet Member for Health and Wellbeing just before the outbreak of the Covid pandemic and was proactive in leading the test, trace and vaccination response locally.

As Blackrod's Mayor in 2022 she raised funds for "Endeavour" a local Domestic abuse charity. She is now Chair of their Board of Trustees. For 5 years she worked tirelessly for local residents and was well known for her availability, her empathy, commitment, hard work and care. Traits she wishes to replicate in Euxton.

Sue is a Magistrate and School Governor. She has family history of the local area as her maternal grandmother worked at the ROF for many years and her paternal grandparents owned a bakers shop n Chorley. Her father was a Coppersmith and historian who worked until his retirement at what was British Leyland. She remembers visiting and walking around Euxton as a child and so felt a "pull" to retire here.

Sue wishes to help keep this lovely village a place where every age group can feel safe, thrive and enjoy and she will work hard for all.

Parish Council Grants



Chair mentioned in her column the Parish Council has a grant fund budget which it can allocate to local groups or projects needing assistance, for the benefit of Euxton residents.

Recent grants have been:

- £350 sponsoring a teams rain jackets at Euxton Villa Football Club
- £1,000 to St Mary's primary school forest area (see pg 6)
- £2,500 to Euxton Methodist Church Hall for roof repairs
- Buckshaw Scouts needed a further £500 to complete a project to place a publically accessible Defibrillator at the Scouts building off Milestone Meadow
- £250 to the Euxton Parish Church Mothers' Union towards the Euxton Branch's 120 year celebration afternoon tea

Previous recent grants have been to Euxton Singers, Euxton Villa Football Club pitch expansion project, Shopmobility new scooters, Community Centre and many others.

The All Purposes Committee has also run larger grant schemes directly to our primary schools. These have provided for nature areas, walking and exercise facilities, wildlife creation also an ECO friendly project around school.

The Committee considers grant applications against a Council policy - which is attached to the website if you wish to read and apply for your group. Local groups can apply to help support a project, as part of other funding from other sources or for a piece of equipment it may need. Grant policy is in the documents section of the website.

Councillor Vacancy

Presently there is a vacancy for a Parish Councillor on Euxton Council.

Applications are invited and any person wishing to serve as a Councillor should write to the Clerk giving details of interests, experience and reasons for wishing to serve. If an election is not called this will be filled via co-option.

To qualify, a person must be a British subject or citizen of the Irish Republic, over 18 years of age and an elector, must reside within the parish of Euxton, or within 3 miles of it, or occupy as owner or tenant any land or premises therein, or have their principal or only place of work there, and must not be disqualified from holding office as a Councillor (details from the Clerk).

Further details of eligibility, procedures of a vacancy, guidance of being a Parish Councillor for Euxton are all available on request from the Clerk or linked on the Council's website to the vacancy notice.


